

## CORE Schools Economics Challenge (CORE-SEC) 2019 Terms and conditions

### General

The Promoter of the competition is CORE Economics Education ('we' or the 'CORE'), 167 Divinity Road, Oxford, OX4 1LP, UK; a charity registered in England and Wales (number 1175143). The supporting partner is Financial Times, 1 Southwark Bridge, London SE1 9HL, UK.

### Conditions of entry

The competition is open to students up to and including 18 years of age. Entries will be accepted from high schools/secondary schools from any country ('schools' or 'entrants'). Only one entry, made by one team, is allowed per school. In addition, schools may each enter only ONE additional collaborative entry with another local school. However, any individual team member may only participate in one team. Teams should be a maximum of 10 students and include individuals in full-time education at a school that is submitting the entry.

Entries must be submitted by the school by 11:59 pm UK time on 30th September 2019. Entries received after this date cannot be considered. They should be submitted as a single media file to CORE by uploading it to a shared storage platform (Dropbox, Google Drive or any other option which is convenient and easy for CORE to access). Schools should also notify CORE of their entry by emailing an entry form to [sec@core-econ.org](mailto:sec@core-econ.org) by the same deadline noted above.

Videos should be made in the English language or in another language with English subtitles.

No purchase is required for entry. No responsibility for late, incomplete, corrupt or lost entries will be accepted.

By entering the competition, entrants agree to these terms and conditions. Failure to comply with these terms and conditions may result in disqualification.

### Judging criteria

Entries will be assessed against the following criteria (weighting in brackets):

- Content - presenting the theme of the competition in an original, creative, and accurate way (40)
- Quality of narrative (40)
- Production quality (20)

Entries should be no longer than three minutes. Five points will be deducted for an entry that is longer than three minutes. The final credits do not count towards the three minute limit.

A CORE judging panel will award the top three prizes and the prize for a collaborative entry. In case of a large number of submissions a shortlisting panel composed of representatives from CORE will shortlist six entries which will be evaluated by the judging panel in the final round.

The judging panel's decisions are final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into.

## Prizes

The prizes will be awarded to the top three entries, as judged by the CORE judging panel:

1st place = £1000 for the school and £500 Amazon vouchers for students

2nd place = £750 for the school and £300 Amazon vouchers for students

3rd place = £500 for the school and £200 Amazon vouchers for students

There will be an additional prize of £1000 for each school and £500 Amazon vouchers for students (shared equally between all the participating students) for the collaborative entry.

Prizes are non-transferable.

Entrants will be notified by email and an announcement will be published on the CORE website on 25th October 2019.

## Entrant's responsibilities

Entrants are required to produce original content rather than repackage other people's work. Throughout the work they must do the following:

- If they are using someone else's ideas, concepts, or materials, they must reference them clearly and avoid plagiarism;
- If they are using someone else's materials (i.e. quotes, video clips, etc.) including from sources such as YouTube, they must ensure they have the appropriate permission/exemptions from copyright to use them. This includes music being played at the beginning or at any time during the video.

Entries that use copyrighted material without proper permission will not be accepted.

Entrants are required to ask any individual interviewed and appearing in the work for consent for their personal data being used in this way, either via video or with a written consent form. Entrants must retain this consent and provide it to CORE upon request (but do not need to produce it as part of their submission).

Entrants will need to obtain consent from parents/legal guardians for students to participate, and for their image to be used in the video if the team members appear in the videos themselves. Entrants must retain this consent and provide it to CORE upon request (but do not need to produce it as part of their submission).

Entrants warrant that their entries are not offensive, defamatory or otherwise unlawful, and do not infringe the intellectual property rights or any other rights of a third party.

## Copyright

Entrants consent to assign all rights, title and interest in and to their entries to the promoter and that CORE shall have all rights to copy, edit, publish and use entries, in whole or in part, in any way they see fit, including for publishing, at CORE's sole discretion, on the CORE website [www.core-econ.org](http://www.core-econ.org), without compensation to the entrants. Rights to edit copy where the promoter deems necessary is reserved although entrants will be fully credited.

We confirm that you shall be able to use the work you entered into the competition for your own commercial or non-commercial purposes. Such use would be on a non-exclusive basis to ensure CORE is able to deal with the material in the manner envisaged above.

## Data collection and privacy

When you enter this competition, you agree for CORE to collect the following personal data: your name, name of the school and the email address of your teacher. These details will only be kept for the duration of the competition and then deleted.

We collect this personal data to assess your eligibility for the competition, to administer the competition and to publicise winning entries.

If you do not provide the information, we will unfortunately be unable to accept your submission.

If a team member appears in the video entered for the completion their image is considered personal data as well. By submitting the video you agree for your personal data, in form of your image, to be held for a longer period and published on the CORE website.

We will not share, sell or otherwise transfer personal data to any third parties or use it for any other purpose not described in these terms and conditions. The photographs, film and sound recordings of the winning entries might be given to trusted third parties for the purposes of displaying the winners of the CORE-SEC 2018 and for advertising and promoting future competitions. The judging panel will have access to the title of your entry only.

We only process your personal data in the United Kingdom. Safeguarding this data is important to us and we will protect it accordingly. We will ensure that all personal data you supply is held in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

## Your rights

You have the right to request copies of the data held about you by CORE and the right to request this data to be withdrawn and erased. To do so, please contact us at [contact@core-econ.org](mailto:contact@core-econ.org).

You have the right to complain to the [Information Commissioner's Office](#) (ICO) if you think there is a problem with the way CORE is holding your data.

## Other

CORE may, at its absolute discretion, cancel, suspend, or vary the competition.

These terms and conditions and the competition will be governed by English law and any disputes arising shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts.

Exclusion of liability: CORE is not responsible for (i) any incorrect or inaccurate information used in connection with the competition; or (ii) failures or errors which may occur in the administration of the competition. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CORE excludes liability and entrants agree to release and hold harmless CORE for any damage, loss, liability or injury to person or property or for any claim arising as a result of producing your video and your entry into the competition.

The competition is void where not permitted by local law. We cannot provide the prizes where we are prohibited from doing so.
